FROM THE CHAPTER DIRECTOR'S CHAIR

Arizona seems to be “under construction” these days. This is an issue for motorcyclists and we need to be very alert when in these construction areas. More and more, construction crews are using those big orange construction barrels to mark the edges of lanes or to separate lanes. These barrels are bright orange with reflective white stripes to make them highly visible night or day. Barrels are a very practical approach to temporary lane markings because they are portable, stackable, and expendable. A crew can carry a hundred barrels on a truck, and quickly erect a line of them. Barrels are held upright and in position by a weight on the bottom. Some barrels have a weight that screws into the inside. Others have a heavy rubber ring that flops over the outside. The point is, although the barrels look big and heavy, they are hollow and made of thin plastic. They aren't fastened in position, just weighted on the bottom and

can slide sideways or be toppled over. Once on its side, a barrel will easily roll around.

If a car or truck should strike a construction barrel, the barrel will be knocked out of the way. But if a motorcycle strikes a barrel, it's possible the bike could go down. Construction barrels are typically placed in long lines to delineate the edge of a lane. The purpose may be to help drivers avoid running off the pavement onto a soft shoulder, or to redirect traffic lanes over the top of existing surface markings. The road crews put the barrels up wherever they seem appropriate, but the resulting location is a key point for motorcyclists.

Where barrels are positioned to the outside of the lane on a cambered shoulder, there is little hazard to motorcyclists since a loose barrel will very likely roll downhill, away from the lane. Sometimes a line of concrete dividers is placed

alongside a lane or between opposing lanes. The concrete dividers are very heavy and will actually divert a vehicle crashing into one. Concrete dividers are sometimes difficult to see at night, so a construction crew may erect a line of plastic barrels next to the concrete divider. Flashing lights can be attached to the tops of the barrels to make them more conspicuous at night.

If the barrels are placed on the other side of the concrete divider, a blown-over barrel is very unlikely to bounce over the divider or roll into your path. However, if the barrels are placed between the concrete divider and your lane, then a blown-over barrel could very likely end up in your lane. The worst case scenario is a line of barrels dividing opposing traffic. An oncoming truck could easily strike a barrel and even if the truck doesn't hit it, a high-speed wind blast could push the barrel sideways or even topple it over. If you are approaching a line of barrels

positioned between lanes, your internal warning alert should go off. And if there is a large truck approaching rapidly in the opposing lane, that's potentially a lethal situation. A barrel on its side is hazardous because just a gust of wind can start it rolling and an upright barrel without a black weight on the bottom is equally hazardous. When you spot one of these dangerous situations you should immediately move farther away, preferably into the next lane. This doesn't mean you have to stay away from these zones. You just need to be on high alert.

AZR RIDE REWARDS—2011

The Ride Rewards program has changed for 2011. Originally, the program was created to promote riding your bike to GWRRA events. Now, instead of being awarded MILEAGE to an event, participants are awarded POINTS for attending, regardless of your mode of transportation. Ride your motorcycle, drive your car, or walk—it will make no difference. Points for attending will be awarded as follows:

AZ-R HIGH MILEAGE AWARD FOR 2011

If you have the luxury of owning two motorcycles, both bikes are eligible. Photos of both odometers are required. Purchase of a new bike will require open and closing photos of both bikes. To be eligible for the Ride Rewards and High Mileage Award Programs, participants must attend a minimum of six AZ-R Chapter Breakfast Gatherings during the 2011 calendar year.

The High Mileage winner - \$100



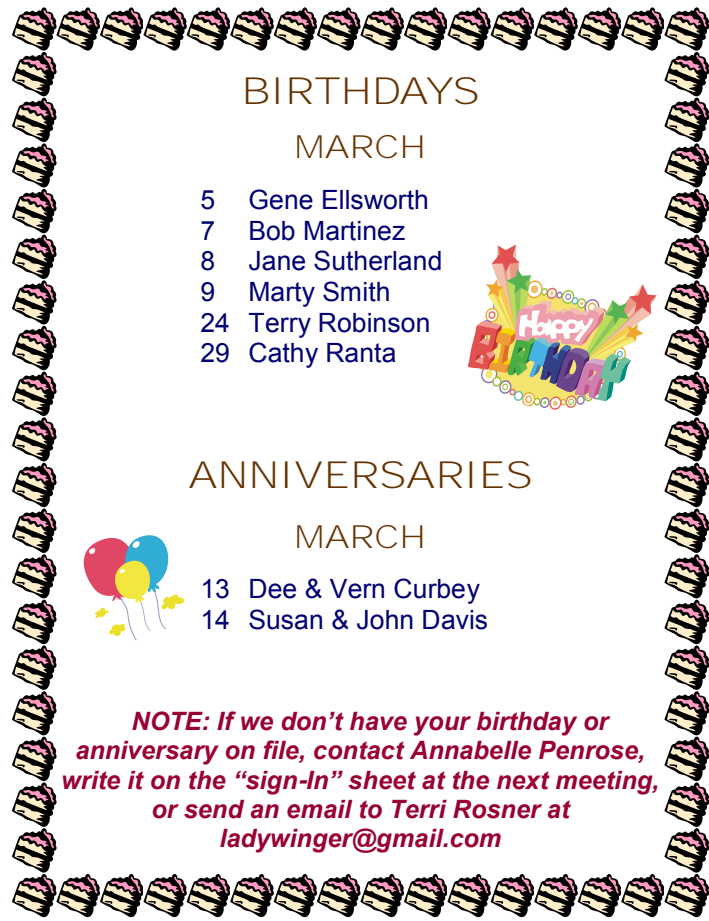
AZR RIDE REWARDS
