## THE SAFE RIDE

Chapter Educator: Richard Thompson

Buyer Beware (or at least be informed) when it's time to replace your riding jacket

Buying a motorcycle helmet that will do its job when needed is pretty simple. Just look for the DOT sticker and you have a helmet that approved for wear in U.S. If it also has a SNELL and CE stamp on it so much the better. The rest of your choice is all fit, color, comfort and design.

But, during my recent search for a new riding outfit, I discovered (once again) how much I didn't know about the subject. So what follows are things to consider and for you to decide what is fact and what is just marketing hype. Sources include marketing materials from several manufacturers that shall remain nameless and several industry magazines and websites. For exhaustive detail on the (EC) European Standards, visit <http://www.pva-ppe.org.uk/standards.htm>.

When many of us were in our teens, jacket choice was pretty simple- tough black leather. But now we have leather in multiple weights and colors, and materials such as Cordura, Ballistic Nylon and Kevlar. Which of these is best? The answer is up to which one you select. The one you will wear will beat the daylights out of a t-shirt. Now how do you know the one you are going to wear will do the job when needed? There are no officially approved safety standards in the United States for motorcycle apparel. The American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) may try to change that in the future, but for now we are limited to the Conformite European (CE) standard used widely in Europe and adopted by some American manufacturers. Testing of body armor to meet the (CE) standard is similar to the U.S.DOT tests for helmets.

The difficult part of this equation is some jackets /pants have a CE approved label which only means the body armor used in them is approved, not the material used to manufacture them. So claims such as "abrasion resistant", "shock absorbing" and "impact resistant" may be misleading the buyer - YOU. For the pants and jacket to live up to these claims, they will have to meet the (PPE) Personal Protective Equipment standards set in England in 1965.

Some of these materials, mesh jackets and ballistic nylon, have polyurethane coatings that reportedly will melt to your body when you happen to be sliding down the pavement unintentionally (we hope). Others are equipped with body armor not approved by (CE) criteria. When that happens, research tells us that there are critical areas of the body needing more protection. The areas receiving the hardest and most frequent impacts are shoulders, hips, knees and the elbows. Be sure your next purchase offers good protection in these areas.

While other areas of the body may not require as much armor, abrasion resistance, seam strength, and tear

resistance are also important considerations. The minimum requirement to meet "high abrasion resistance" (sliding on your back, for ex:) is 4 seconds, an ordinary pair of jeans provides 0.6 sec. and a single layer of 1.4mm of cowhide will last 5.8 sec.

The material itself should have a tear strength strong enough to repel a sharp object from penetrating the outer layer and be lined with a lining slippery enough to allow your body to slide against the external shell, further reducing the risk of your skin from being penetrated by the sharp object that happens to get through the outer layer. Additionally the lining should have a high melting point to insure it doesn't melt into your skin under the friction from ROAD SURFING.

No material will do any good if the seams separate under stress. A test reported in Motorcycle News, in the UK found out only 4 out of 18 leather suits from the major European manufacturers passed all the tests against the European Standard. Twelve suits failed the burst test due to either the thread and/or leather failure. (You can bet they were labeled seconds and shipped to other than major motorcycle dealers.)

Look carefully at the seams. Seams in the critical areas should have at least one row of concealed or protected stitching to hold the seams together after the visible stitching has been worn away against the road surface. Check the stitching - it should be spaced equally with no dropped stitches, which indicates a potential weak seam.

Leather should have 11-14 stitches per 5cm, fabric should have 13-16 stitches per 5cm. Too few stitches means the seam will be too weak, and too many will actually weaken the material. Additional layers should be double stitched.

Getting the correct answers to all this requires research. Magazine reviews and motorcycle websites are a good place to start. Myself and the writer of the article originally, Bob Berry have had good luck talking directly to the various manufacturers. Most of them were straightforward with their answers to our questions.

So which jacket is best? To say again, the one you are going to wear. Choose for comfort, utility, and visibility, then decide the price by what you think your life is worth.

### AZ-R HIGH MILEAGEAWARD FOR 2011

This is strictly a mileage award for Chapter R participants. The contest will run for the calendar year, starting 1/1/2011. Participants will need to submit a time/date stamped digital photo of their odometer on or after Jan. 1st. I suggest you place your GWRRA card in the photo for ID purposes. There is no restriction on how you get the miles—rides after chapter meetings, commuting, and riding to Wing Ding are examples. Send the photos to me at rcs43@live.com. If you have the luxury of owning two motorcycles, both bikes are eligible. Photos of both odometers will be required. Purchase of a new bike will require open and closing photos of both bikes.

To be eligible for both contests, participants must have attended 6 AZ-R chapter meetings during the calendar year.

### AWARDS

The Top Participation Points winner will receive \$100.

Second place will receive \$50.

The remaining participants' names will be put into a hat and the winning draw will receive \$25.

The High Mileage winner will receive \$100.

## 2010 ARIZONA DISTRICT RALLY

What an event..! The annual GWRRA District Convention was held in Tucson this year at the Hilton East Hotel & Resort. The facilities were perfect for our group and the attendance, vendors and comments all showed this to be the premier event of the season. Ten Arizona chapters and guests from California, Nevada, Utah, Colorado, New Mexico, Texas and Ohio (perhaps more States) were in attendance. Total registration was 448 members.

Starting with facilities, everything was under one roof. You did not need to travel to other parts of the city, no long walks between venues, and unless you took one of the beautiful tour rides, you didn't even ride your bike for three days.

Do you like vendors? Well, we had 35 at this rally, and there were 15 more that were turned away due to a lack of space; that's an issue we are working on to expand the vendor size next year. Everything from handmade pens to motorcycle dealers, plenty of chrome and polish, lots of information and education booths, insurance, shirts, bike wash, headsets, helmets, jewelry, and much, much more. There was so much there that it was like a mall, walking from store to store.

Do you like prizes? The door prizes, grand prizes and 50-25-25 draws at this convention were beyond belief. Almost \$1000 was given away in 50/50 draws over 3 days. There were 6 (or was it 7?) sets of tires drawn in the grand prizes. Door prizes filled the room we had for display.

If Education is your forte, there were seminars on everything your could think of – web sites, packing a bike, member reports, motorcycle awareness, newsletters, crash scene response, group riding, and of course, first aid & CPR. The Rider Education table had some great grand prizes and information on the Rider Ed program, ERC/ARC classes, Trike classes and more. Open forums with the District and Region Directors were held Friday and Saturday. And Shirley Garcia, co-founder of GWRRA, gave a talk on how things all began.

Friday night's ice cream social was hosted by the Hilton around the pool area. It was a perfect setting and perfect weather for a great social gathering.

If you like to watch members perform, we had an excellent IOY (Individual of the Year) and COY (Couple of the Year) program. All of the participants were top-notch and the judges had to make a close decision. This year's winners were IOY: DW Gary from Chapter AZA; and COYs Dave & Dee Gormley, also from Chapter AZA. The best-dressed competition fell to a close battle between AZG (Green Valley) and AZA (Tucson), with AZA pulling off the victory. The chapter mascot, scrapbook, banner and shirt competition was also close with Chapters AZA, AZK and AZR all winning awards.

Bike performances are something we can all appreciate. The GWRRA Skills games are a combination of fun and talent that lets riders try a course set to test their abilities, but also to make it fun doing so. Bikes, tikes and even a sidecar went though the course this year. The awesome performance by the Arizona Drill team is a highlight every year, and they made it even better this year, using a light pole in the center of the parking lot as a magnet for a finale that wowed the crowd. In addition, Jerry Cowan from CA1M put on his one-man show of daredevil riding. That man is scary and awesome in the same sentence..! The bike show displayed the fine chrome and paint jobs on several bikes and rewarded those that do a lot of work to keep their bikes so shiny. They were great to look at, too. Finally, the light parade got delayed slightly, but was really cool with lights that shined and entertained the audience.

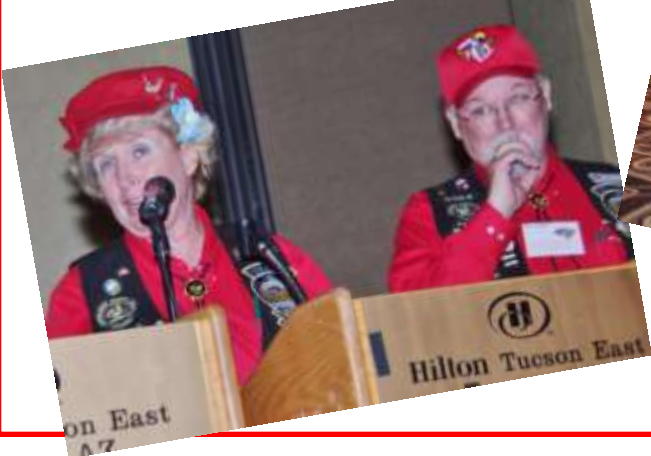

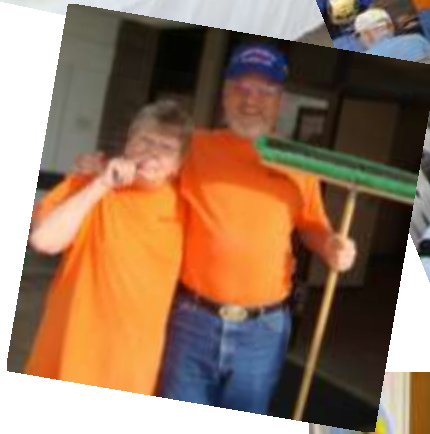
